PROGRAMS

Engaging people: Through the Adopt-A-Block program, neighborhood block coordinators are given tools to keep their blocks beautiful. The Great Indy Cleanup program enables neighbors to organize community cleanups to combat illegal dumping. KIB Clubs allow youths grades K-12 to explore their environment by building “outdoor classrooms” on school grounds. The Youth Tree Team gives high school students the opportunity to water recently planted trees while receiving enrichment opportunities and learning to take pride in their city.

Enhancing nature: IPL Project Greenspace, which creates green space within communities, and NeighborWoods, which plants urban trees, work to bring the benefits of being “green” to communities. In addition to bringing beauty to city neighborhoods, urban greening programs play an important role in tackling public health concerns and improving quality of life.


