PROGRAMS


Community support, education and awareness: #REACH is a monthly event for ages 18-25 to celebrate and socialize with their peers and allies. The Chris Gonzalez Library & Archives is the city's only LGBT library, featuring over 7,500 titles. Indy Pride awards thousands of dollars in scholarships each year to college students and high school seniors. The Indianapolis LGBT Film Festival benefits the Indiana Youth Group, a non-profit organization which serves the needs of Indiana LGBT teens. The Indy Pride Bag Ladies Halloween bus tour of bars and restaurants in Indianapolis raises money for patients who have been diagnosed with HIV/AIDS. Started in 1981, Bag Ladies is one of the oldest HIV/AIDS fundraising organizations in the country.

FUNDRAISER


