



**1972:** Indiana Convention Center built at 100 S. Capitol Ave., with less than 200,000 total square feet.  
**Cost: \$26.1M**

**1983:** RCA Dome and two exhibit halls added.  
**Cost: \$94.7M**  
[\$77.5M for dome]



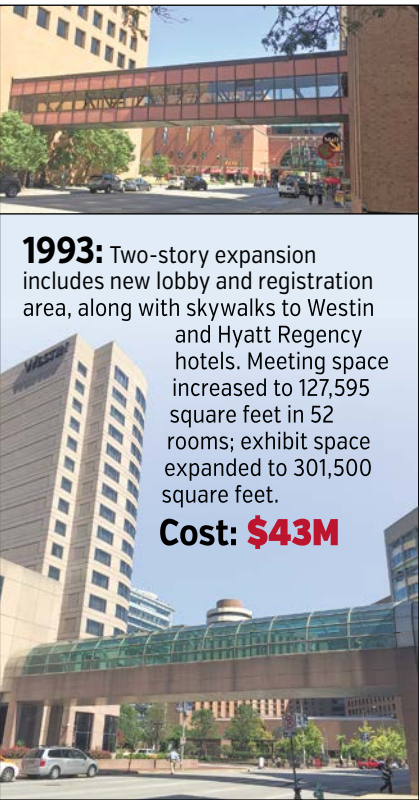

**2011:** Expansion onto the former RCA Dome site includes 254,000 square feet of exhibit space, 63,000 square feet of meeting rooms, 103,000 square feet of pre-function and registration space, a three-story glass entry pavilion at Capitol Avenue and Georgia Street, and an enclosed walkway between the convention center and Lucas Oil Stadium. The two facilities now offer a total 937,000 square feet of convention and meeting space.  
**Cost: \$275M**

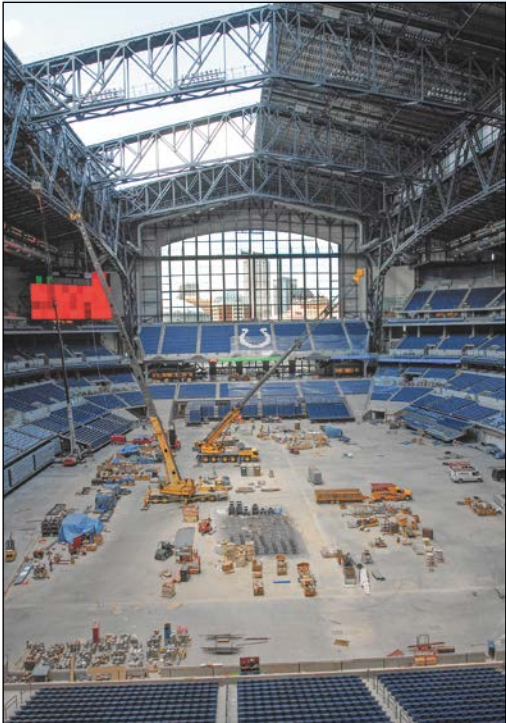


**1993:** Two-story expansion includes new lobby and registration area, along with skywalks to Westin and Hyatt Regency hotels. Meeting space increased to 127,595 square feet in 52 rooms; exhibit space expanded to 301,500 square feet.  
**Cost: \$43M**



**2000:** Westward expansion adds 100,000 square feet in exhibition halls, meeting rooms, a ballroom, an entrance at Maryland and West streets, and a skywalk to the Indianapolis Marriott Downtown.  
**Cost: \$45M**

**2008:** Lucas Oil Stadium opens, seats 63,000 for Indianapolis Colts games—including 137 luxury suites—and is expandable to 70,000 seats. Also includes 183,000 square feet of contiguous exhibition space and 12 meeting rooms, a welcome plaza and party deck.  
**Cost: \$750M**
