PROGRAMS

General: Coburn Place provides women who have suffered from domestic violence and their children a chance to start anew, to finally accomplish a dream that an abusive partner and circumstances prevented. We provide safe, affordable housing with fully furnished apartments. We provide the encouragement and supportive services necessary for self-sufficiency. And we provide time, up to two years, to begin healing and move toward a life of independent living.

Services and facility: case management, individual and family therapy, support groups, economic education, children's after-school activities and seasonal camps. The facility features: 35 fully-furnished apartments (one to three bedrooms), 24-hour security, secure parking, two computer labs, an indoor children's recreation area, an outdoor playground, a fitness center, a large community room and laundry.
