PROGRAMS

Land Protection, Land Management, Education: The Central Indiana Land Trust employs science-based approaches to preserving the most important remaining natural areas in central Indiana. The Land Trust has preserved 3,800 acres and continues to grow. Volunteers and the local community are engaged in the care and maintenance of each property to achieve specific conservation objectives. To engage more constituents in land conservation, the Land Trust targets education efforts to landowners, landowner advisers and community leaders.
