PROGRAMS

Stable and secure services: NPower assesses the state of current IT, advises on technology solutions that fit organization needs, assists in budget planning, and identifies staff training needs. The team also builds and repairs networks, and performs regular on-premise or remote maintenance services. NPower members can access HelpDesk services during business hours.

Efficient and effective services: NPower designs and hosts websites, provides database consulting services, and develops electronic marketing and communication tools. The team teaches not-for-profit staff to update and add to websites without relying on outside design services. Technologists work with organizational leaders to create and fully use database applications for a variety of donor, volunteer and constituent needs.

Assessments and planning: Helps minimize technology-related crises, uses staff time efficiently, and avoids financial waste on equipment.
