PROGRAMS

Supportive housing: HVAF operates transitional homes and apartments that serve more than 200 veterans. A 51-bed apartment complex will open in the fall of 2011. Veterans receive individual case management while working toward financial stability, permanent housing and improved quality of life.

Residential, Employment and Substance Abuse Treatment (REST): A supportive and intensive recovery dynamics-based program for homeless veterans whose primary goal is to maintain sobriety while obtaining employment and permanent housing. Veterans receive individual and group counseling, psycho-educational classes and intensive case management.

Special Needs/Vet to Vet: Intensive case management and housing for 24 homeless veterans with chronic mental illness diagnoses. HVAF Special Needs staff includes two full-time social workers and two peer counselors.

FUNDRAISER

The third annual Freedom Ride and Summer Festival raised \$5,900 in 2010. This year's ride begins at 10 a.m. July 30 at Harley-Davidson of Indianapolis, 4146 E. 96th St., followed by HVAF's opening ceremony and annual summer festival at HVAF's Warman property, 240 N. Warman Ave.
