### PROGRAMS

Grant making: Of every dollar raised, 75 percent goes to local organizations providing breast health education, screenings, treatment assistance and survivor support. In 2010, Komen funds enabled 21 organizations to provide nearly 40,000 low-income and uninsured or under-insured central Indiana residents with breast health education, early detection, treatment assistance, survivor support and to fund scientific research seeking improved treatments and ultimately a cure for the disease. In 2011, the affiliate will grant \$1.6 million to 17 organizations to continue funding the fight against breast cancer. These organizations will reach nearly 30,000 low-income women and men with life-saving breast health services.

Research: Of every dollar raised, 25 percent goes to the Komen Research Grant Program to fund scientific research seeking improved treatments and ultimately the cure for breast cancer. Several Komen-funded research grants are in use at Indiana University and Purdue University.

Education and outreach: Komen Central Indiana collaborates with other agencies on a variety of initiatives to educate medical providers, breast cancer victims and the general public about breast health, breast cancer, new treatments, clinical trials and research findings.

#### **FUNDRAISER**


The 20th Central Indiana Race for the Cure will take place April 16. With more than 40,000 participants, this is the sixth-largest Komen race in the country. Last year, the race raised \$2.5 million, or 80 percent of the affiliate's annual revenue.
