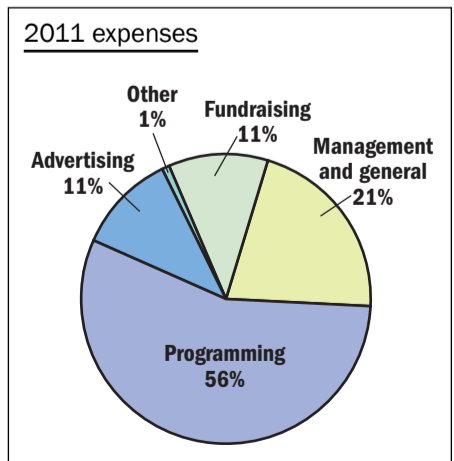
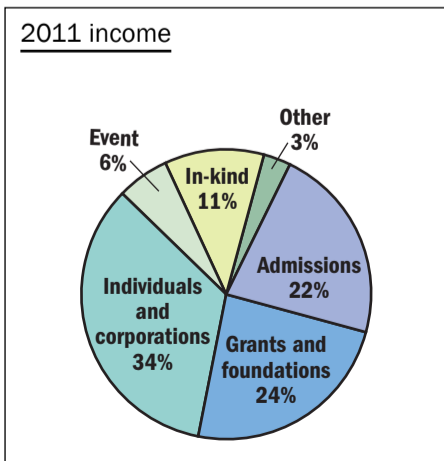
FUNDRAISER
