PROGRAMS

Early childhood education: The Flanner House Child Development Center has provided high-quality education at a subsidized rate for low-income families for over 80 years. The program is values-infused and academically challenging, including foreign language. The program is state-licensed and accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children.

Senior Program: Provides socialization and quality-of-life enrichment for people 60 and older. Participants assemble daily at the center and have access to an array of services including health screenings, nutrition counseling, shopping, transportation and exercise classes.

Center For Working Families: Provides job-skills training, financial education, computer training. Challenges participants to make lifestyle and behavioral changes that will improve their situations. An array of social-service interventions for crisis situations is also provided to qualified families and individuals.
