## PROGRAMS

**Hunger relief:** Prepares and delivers thousands of nutritious meals every day at no cost. Those meals feed people in shelters, day cares, community centers and other programs that feed hungry people but don't have the budgets to pay for food. Second Helpings has prepared and delivered over 6 million meals.

**Culinary job training:** Offers an intensive, 10-week culinary job training program for unemployed and displaced individuals. The program aims to endow students with the professional skills to attain a meaningful career in the culinary industry, helping to end poverty at its source. Second Helpings has graduated 483 students.

**Food rescue:** Rescues over 1 million pounds of perishable and overstocked food annually. Second Helpings works with donors in the food industry—distributors, grocers, caterers, restaurants and others—to safely and efficiently collect surplus food. Second Helpings has rescued over 16 million pounds of food. Food rescue is accomplished with refrigerated trucks and vans and drivers who have been trained in food safety and sanitation. Second Helpings will not collect any food deemed unsafe or inedible.

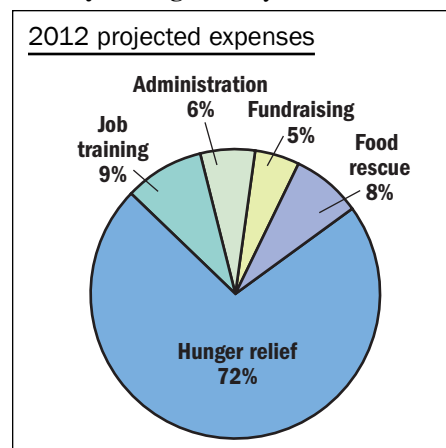
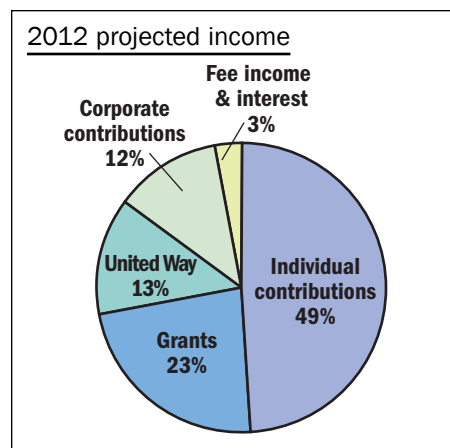
## FUNDRAISER
