PROGRAMS

Advocacy: Positive youth development practice is at the core of MCCOY's advocacy efforts at the local, state and national levels. Through the Youth Advocacy Council, MCCOY is working to ensure that youth have a voice in policy decisions that affect them. MCCOY's priority issues include: youth dropout prevention, youth program quality assessment, youth worker professional development, early intervention and prevention, and youth engagement.

Early intervention & prevention initiative: Intends to eliminate child abuse, neglect and juvenile delinquency through comprehensive community efforts that coordinate, build capacity and advocate for high-quality, early intervention and prevention services in Marion County. The city-county-appointed Early Intervention and Planning Council governs the EIP initiative.

Student success initiative: Aims to ensure all students have equal opportunities to success in school and life. The initiative identifies barriers and solutions, raises awareness about education-related policies, and engages students and families through the "Own Your Future" program.

Training hub: Has provided more than 1,500 hours of training and networking to youth development professionals on how to better work with the youth they serve. The program has trained 15 organizations through the Youth Program Quality Assessment and Improvement process.
