PROGRAMS

Youth volunteers: Kids and teens, ages 10 to 18, work with staff, adult volunteers and other young participants on everything from special events and daily operations to portraying historic characters.

Student programs: Provides discounts to student and school groups and served more than 60,000 participants on-site in 2012. Also provides leadership development, classroom resources and outreach programs to students. Programs meet Indiana academic standards in social studies, science, language arts, math and music.

FUNDRAISER

History-on-Tap, developed and hosted by the Conner Prairie Horizon Council, raised \$7,000 in 2012, which was its first year. The event featured local craft beers. The next one is scheduled for May 31 at Conner Prairie.

The Apple Store, which is open September and October, features hand-dipped caramel apples, apple cider and gifts. The store raised \$67,000 in 2012.

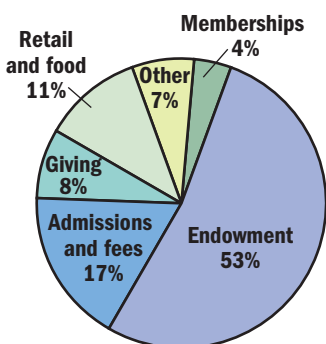
