PROGRAMS

Grant program: Of the money raised, 75 percent is granted out annually to local not-for-profit agencies that provide breast health outreach, early screening and detection, treatment assistance, and survivor support services for low-income Hoosiers. In March, Komen awarded \$1.3 million to 14 agencies in central Indiana, programs that will reach 30,000 women and men. The remaining 25 percent goes to fund scientific research seeking improved treatments, causes and ultimately a cure for the disease.

Breast cancer awareness programs: Komen conducts education seminars, webinars and other types of events to educate the public and medical providers about breast cancer.

Pink Ribbon Celebration: An annual survivor celebration bringing hundreds of breast cancer survivors and their friends and family together for a luncheon and inspirational speaker. This year's celebration will be Sept. 8 at the Ritz Charles.

The annual Race for the Cure will be April 20 in downtown Indianapolis. Komen also hosts an annual Pink Tie Ball fundraiser in February.
